Commissioner Zimmerlink stated the Planning and Zoning Office had indicated highway and bridge projects. She said the Agenda item says consider placing on the agenda selecting two priorities projects for SPC`S region listing one project for each congressional district, Critz & Shuster.

Commissioner Zapotosky said we requested \$10,000,000.00 and a reauthorization of a highway bill under Rt. 21. He added we also secured \$60,000,000.00 in spike funding for the construction of the Masontown Bridge.

Commissioner Vicites spoke about the two projects which are important in Fayette County`s future, one being the continuation of the third phase concerning, Fayette County Business Park on Rt. 40. The request made in 2010 was 8.6 million dollars for the third and final phase. He added having a future land secured for a business park / industrial park in the southern end of the county and when the Mon Fayette Valley expressway opens we need to have another place after the Fayette Business Park being it will rapidly fill up the area around Springhill Township.

We want working families, and Union Workers to have the opportunity to work in these types of projects that are government related so when they are put out for proposal and bid. He added we want trained skilled workers in these positions. They should get the living wage prevailing ways that's in labor law.

Commissioner Zapotosky added this term will be 3 years from that date we enter into the agreement with 90 day expiration prior to the date of the initial term or an excessive term.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said you have to follow the prevailing wage which is a Federal Law. She also said their vote just eliminated open, fair and competitive bidding of construction jobs in Fayette County and discriminates the non-union skilled workforce, minorities and small business. She said construction projects are taxpayers funded and when competition is reduced it drives up a cost of a project saying it is not in the public's best interest to drive up cost.

Commissioner Zimmerlink also addressed the members of the audience saying there are many union members here and that their job is to look after your fellow union member but that is the Commissioners job to look after the best interest of all taxpayers.
