Mrs. Mazza asked the Commissioners, where you are on creating your own Human Resource Dept.

Commissioner Zapotosky stated interviews are being set up.

Mr. Mike McDavid announced he wanted to introduce himself to everyone and stated he is employed with Pa. Cooperative Extension & working with CCAP and has oversight in 11 Counties. Mr. Mc David said he works with the County Commissioners Assoc. in Pennsylvania. He offered his assistance in any way to the Commissioners.

Mr. Mazza commented about the water bill and Water Co. He felt they are doing us a favor by allowing us to make payments though he feels it was caused by their inefficiency and they need to take responsibility in the matter.

Commissioner Zapotosky explained to Mr. Mazza about the meeting that took place with the water Co. they had provided us with the PCU Statues that was clearly indicated that the bill itself was valid.

Warren Hughes County Manger stated that bill apparently is been going on well over the 4 years and if you take into consideration the bill was only the water consumption of the prison, they have 3 water meters and all of the utilities the electricity, water,& gas is lumped together.

Commissioner Zimmerlink stated we know how much utilities are for the jail.

Commissioner Zapotosky said the new meter was installed in 2004; it was enter in as a 5 dial reading opposed to should have been a 6 dial reading.

Mr. Mazza commented on the Falice & Associates concereneing the original contract which was \$8200.00. He stated Nov 30, 2008 according to Commissioner Vicites last week there was an amendment made, according to the contract the amendment has to be signed by 2 Commissioners.

Commissioner Zapotosky stated the addendum that had been adopted during that time frame was when Commissioner Hardy was involved. He said he contacted John Falice and asked him if he would still provide services above and beyond the terms of the agreement, at that time he informed me that he would at the full price of \$10,200.00, that means \$8200.00 that was in the contract plus the addendum which would have been Mr. Hardy's share in that point of time and will continue providing the balance whether it be John Felice or another firm

Karen Kuhns Courts Administrator stated she was sent here by Judge Cappuzzi to see when their computer systems will be repaired. Mrs. Kuhns said she called for other assistance for the solutions until an IT Director is available.

Commissioner Zapotosky stated we will soon take care of the problems.

Michael Cavanaugh stated there is no need to raise the cost of the Right to know forms to the maximum that the law allows.

Commissioner Zapotosky stated Sean Lally County Controller had made the recommendation based on what he defined the loss of money.

Mr. Cavanaugh did not agree that Commissioner Zimmerlink did anything wrong when contacting PCU.

Commissioner Zapotosky stated it wasn't that she did anything wrong , the question

was she filed an Informal formal complaint , the question that was raised by virtue of that is a valid issue for the PCU to explore based on the fact that it did not have the concurrence of a second Commissioner.

Valerie Thompson stated on the 9th of April I presented to the Planning Commission an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance about Windmills , the Planning Commissioner voted in favor of that and you will have an opportunity to vote on that after a Public Hearing. She said she lives in Fayette County and she believes in the development in Renewable Energy.
