Commissioner Zimmerlink stated that while she supports alternate energy projects and the windmill project in Fayette County she said it must be in compliance with the current Zoning Ordinance. She said Solicitor Ferens gave an opinion, while not a formal written one, through an email which she read where he said this matter is in the hands of the Court who are capable of making a decision and that an agreement if signed could have a perception of political influence. **Solicitor Ferens** confirmed his comment adding that if all parties signed the agreement it would mean there would be no need for further Court action .

Commissioner Vicites asked Solicitor Ferens if the Commissioners asked him for a legal opinion. **Solicitor Ferens** said the only legal advice asked was could the Commissioners

intervene and he said yes and that the matter is now before the Court but the Commissioners could advise the Court of their support. **Commissioner Zapotosky** commented that at the time of the hearing there were unresolved issues pertaining to the residents on Skyline Drive and turbines # 3 and #27 but that now the two turbines will be eliminated. **Commissioner Vicites** said he now does support the project being that PPG listened to the residents' concerns and the two turbines will be eliminated. He said he feels that is a great accomplishment and will be a great impact for the County. **Commissioner Zimmerlink** stated her concern that since the Stipulation Agreement was signed the appeal would be withdrawn and the Court would not hear the issues which is what at least two Commissioners initially wanted. **Solicitor Ferens** stated that if everyone signs the Stipulation and withdraws the appeal then there is nothing for the Courts to decide.

- Public Comment

Louise Dawensey commented on the silent prayer saying she felt it is most appropriate to keep it

the way it now is because in Fayette County there are many diversified religions. She also thanked the Commissioners for the monies that were given to the Libraries in the past and is hoping that their generosity continues. Mrs. Dawensey acknowledged the Commissioners as the educational Commissioners.

Mr. Larry Williams from Sky Line Drive commented on the windmill project. He asked the Commissions if they thought the Zoning Hearing Board may have made the wrong decision. **Commissioner Zapotosky** said he did his research, not just in regard to the ZHB decision, but also in regard to the stipulation agreement. He said intervention is separate from our personal belief of alternative energy which he believe in, but said his intervention decision was entirely separate and based on the ZHB decision. **Commissioner Vicites** commented that he thought a lot on this issue and has done research in other Counties .He said he has been concerned about the residents that this project will affect but he felt it was handled well that we have to come to a conclusion and do something to broaden our alternative energy resources. He said PPM told him that they addressed the concerns of the residents and that is why he now supports the project. He said this is one way to help the County grow and it will be in the best interest of the citizens of Fayette County. **Commissioner Zimmerlink** reiterated her support of alternative energy but said that the Zoning Hearing Board is charged with upholding the Zoning Ordinance and because there were concerns on whether that was done she supported an intervention with the Courts for the Courts to determine that issue.

Rev. Ewing Marietta from Dunbar commented on offering a prayer at the beginning of the Commissioners monthly meetings saying he felt it would be a Mission Statement that God will bless Fayette County and guide the Commissioners with his presence. He said it would be a simple prayer to help with the decisions that are made which will help Fayette County for years to come. He offered to coordinate the prayer events. The Rev. was informed that the Commissioners Tabled the matter.

Tanya Cellurale, Office Manager at Joeys Auto Body & Repair Shop in Connellsville, commented about a zoning issue that is taking place between the Cellurale family and the Planning & Zoning Office. She stated Joseph Cellurale Sr. wants to add his son Joseph Cellurale Jr. on the deed to his property. She said the family has been waiting for 3 months and she doesn't understand why this process has taken so long. **Commissioner Zapotosky** said he spoke with the Director of Planning and Zoning and was told they should have received information from Attorney Newcomer. Mrs. Cellurale replied they have not and she would phone him and ask for a status and a report on this matter. **Commissioner Vicites** said he will get an answer on this issue.

Carol Williams of West Leisenring, a current passenger of FACT stated she uses this service to get back and forth to work and there have been problems. She said she attended meetings and voiced her concerns Mrs. Williams called for the resignation of Michelle Grant Shumar and said to dissolve the current transportation committee and said Commissioner Zimmerlink should excuse herself from transportation decisions because she always sides with the FACT office. **Commissioner Zimmerlink** reminded Mrs. Williams that she attended a recent meeting with FACT staff, the three Commissioners and representatives from Harrisburg but as Mrs. Williams knows the program has to be within Harrisburg's guidelines.

Commissioner Zapotosky said we have to start working to solve these problems and accept the responsibilities. **Commissioner Vicites** said he has addressed the problems every time Mrs. Williams called his office and he sent emails directly to the FACT office to be resolved and he will continue to do so. He said we have to start at the top of the organization and work our way down to identify the issues. **Commissioner Vicites** said he will do anything to solve these problems because the transportation system is too important to the people who depend on it. He added that Mrs. Williams is legally blind which she confirmed and she added that it is her choice not to drive and instead use public transportation.
