**Population Report:** We have 234 males 34 females with 16 females in Greene County for a total of 268. 1 inmate is in the Hospital for surgery bill is going to the state as he is a state inmate. As of March 1, 2010 the Prison started accepting collateral bonds.

Commissioner Zapotosky is asking about the overtime situation, and Warden Miller is explaining that it is back to normal. The Commissioner is also speaking of the situation with the sewage in the prison. An informational meeting was held to explain the situation what needs to be done. Money was not budgeted for this problem. And he would like this board to offer a recommendation with regards to the matter. This is an environmental issue.

Commissioner Zimmerlink is explaining that back in 2005 or 2006 the commissioners approved the advertisement of bids, and that she was informed that no bids were received. Another discussion was held and the County Manager stated that Warden still wanted to have more information. Calls were made and received a price from one company and that the material was around \$15,000.00 in 2005 or 2006. Company indicated that they did not want to respond to the bid, their price was their price.

Commissioner Zapotosky is stating that in his recent discussions with Phil Mahoney the problem has been on going and the most recent being Martin Luther Kings Holiday at where the County will be receiving a bill for \$1200.00 in clean up costs. A grinder is being discouraged because in time the grinder will burn itself out. In discussions it was said that the county should utilize a chopper or a basket or the combination of both. Main artery of sewage would have to be done and would require some cleanup on a regular basis.

Warden Miller states that basically what they are submitting to us is a miniature sewage plant. We need a pit below and would require machinery to be cleaned, and the waste would have to be disposed up properly. Were the overflow is the Prison is checking both manholes on the mainline and the overflow compartment. This is being documented by the maintenance officer. The problem is that the inmates are using the toilets as their garbage cans. The Warden made rounds with the inmates and told them that the commissary will be eliminated if they continue to flush their garbage down the toilets.

Commissioner Zapotosky states that this is good, that you are doing this but according to DEP we still have to have a preventative measure, or the DEP will fine us.

Warden Miller is explaining that they brought over one of the toilets and they are working on designing a trap for the toilets, so that it can possible catch objects before they reach the sewage system.

Commissioner Zapotosky wants everyone to realize that all of these measures must be approved by the Sewage Authority before implementing.

Commissioner Vicites states that he likes the approach, but the Sewage Authority must be involved because of DEP. They must concur with your approach. Get them on board early so they can give their approval. The inmates should have serious consequences if caught causing the problem. This is causing tax payers money.
