

A meeting of the Fayette County Board of Commissioners was held at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, December 15, 2015 at the Public Safety Building, Uniontown PA.

**Commissioner Ambrosini** called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m. A silent prayer was held. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Commissioner Zapotosky said he wanted to wish everyone a blessed and happy holidays.

**Public Comment on Agenda Items**

**Before taking** any comment, Commissioner Ambrosini reminded all that comments are limited to three minutes. He said if a question is asked, that time is included in the total.

**Joel Means**, CEO of Ohiopyle Post and River Tours, one of the rafting companies at Ohiopyle, said he was at the meeting in support of the amendment to the hotel tax. He said before now, non-profits get grants and now they are looking at allowing for profits to get marketing grants. He said the four outfitters in Ohiopyle are in favor of that. He said they were opposed to the tax the way it was. He continued to talk about how much money they bring into the county and how they can bring people to the county. He said company's like his need the marketing dollars. Mary Lou Rawl from Benner's Camping in Farmington, a second generation business owner, said she is excited for getting marketing dollars for her business. She said the tourism industry is one of the number one industries in the county and they bring in a lot of tax dollars. She said it will move the county forward in a positive direction. An owner of Wilderness Voyagers said they are a company that could benefit if the MOU is changed. He said he is supportive of changing the tax and this is a way to help them. He said he imported people to work for him as none of his managers were originally from Fayette County.

**A representative** from Kentuck Knob asked the commissioners to approve the amendment. She said it is important to include for profit businesses, adding that they have 30,000 visitors annually. Reneé Seifert, president of the Laurel Highlands Visitor's Bureau, said she is also a Fayette County resident. She thanked the commissioners for their consideration to the amendment. She said there has been a problem in Confluence where half is in Westmoreland County and half is in Fayette County. She said it puts things on a level playing field. Pam Cruz, the owner of a restaurant in Ohiopyle, said she supported the amendment. She said they supply jobs to Fayette Countians and she hoped they approved it.

**Michael Cavanagh** said he was happy to see everyone supporting tourism, but he was there for different reasons. He said under commissioners and HR, specifically IT. He said the firing of the IT director, through his sources he understands that the guy has a good, if not spotless employment record. He talked about firing somebody, and at the same meeting, approving an IT proposal submitted by Ford Business Machines. He was critical of the two Democratic commissioners firing of the IT director and the \$840,000 contract without a bid or RFP. He said that is why they got booted out of office and he is so glad he won't have to see them again. Geraldine Mazza said they fired the guy, are they going to have another lawsuit? She mentioned the lawsuit filed by Brian Miller, who was suspended and then reinstated. She said they are ridiculous. Emma Jane Davis said she is against Ford because it wasn't put out properly. She said it should be let go and let the new people make the decision.

**Muriel Nuttall**, executive director of the Fayette County Chamber of Commerce, thanked the commissioners for supporting local vendors. Jim Hercik said in the 2015 budget there was an allocation of \$500,000 for the ARC payment and if it wasn't done, it should be done. He asked if there was money in the 2016 budget for the ARC payment. Terry Kriss said he wanted to comment on the financial condition of the county. He said the county is broke and he knows that because for the past six weeks he has been unable to get his \$700 reimbursement. He then relayed how he spoke with various people in the planning and Controller's offices and was told he would be receiving his check soon. He then said that he was told different stories about whether or not Acting Controller Sidney Bush was in her office, and accused her of screening his calls and of lying to him. He asked why he had to wait four years to have a hearing and to wait two months for a refund. He asked if he is going to get his money. Commissioner Ambrosini said it depends, they have issues with the state budget. Mr. Kriss said that has nothing to do with the general fund budget and both Commissioners Ambrosini and Zapotosky said it does. Mr. Kriss again asked if he would get his payment. Commissioner Ambrosini thanked him for his comments.

**Commissioner Zapotosky** said Mr. Kriss will get his money. He said the state budget does impact the county budget. He said, as an example, the county loaned CYS \$750,000. Following a discussion about public comment rules, Mrs. Mazza insisted about speaking. Commissioner Ambrosini told Mrs. Mazza to sit down and a discussion then ensued between Mr. Kriss and Commissioner Zapotosky. Commissioner Zimmerlink said regarding the hotel tax, if any of the non-profits remember, she was supportive and tried to move forward, adding that it wasn't a dollar for dollar match as it is now. She said comments that were made that said Zimmerlink was against a hotel tax were untrue. She said she put a plan forward to give money to non-profits as well as the for profits, but she didn't agree with the dollar to dollar match. She said although she will support and move the MOU forward, she will ask the incoming commissioners to hold a meeting to address issues that don't need to be pushed forward. She commented about changing applications dates, adding it wouldn't make that much of a difference to hold a special meeting with the new board of commissioners to look at the MOU and review the criteria. She said she will ask the new board to address the MOU.

**Commissioner Zimmerlink** said it has been reported that the only change is for the non-profits. She said the composition of the grant board is being asked to be changed as well. She talked about what the composition currently is. She and Muriel Nuttall then discussed what the commissioners were sent. Mrs. Nuttall outlined the composition of the hotel tax board. She said the only change is marketing, for profit, one to one match. Commissioner Zimmerlink said the IT proposal should be set aside. She said although an RFP isn't required, they should still seek proposals. She spoke about the requirements in county code, adding that she has read it numerous times. She then spoke about the proposal from Ford, comments about supporting local businesses and how "county code is county code." She said regarding the budget and the ARC, \$500,000 was allocated for 2015 and she made inquiries of the Controller's office for it to be transferred, adding that she was not aware of any inquiries for it to be transferred. Commissioner Zimmerlink asked the Chief Clerk if it was transferred during 2015 and Chief Clerk Revak said she was not aware that it was. Commissioner Zimmerlink asked Sam Lynch if he knew that it was transferred. Mr. Lynch said it was not.

**Commissioner Zimmerlink** asked if there was an ARC payment allocation for 2016. Mr. Lynch said there is not. Commissioner Zimmerlink said regarding the financial condition of the county, she asked Mr. Kriss what the reason was he was given that the \$700 check would not be sent to you until a couple of weeks. Mr. Kriss said because the county has no money. Commissioner Zimmerlink asked the Chief Clerk where the CYS money came from, adding that she signed it. Mr. Lynch said it came from Act 13. Commissioner Zimmerlink said "which we should have done, it happens because of the state budget." She said a total of \$750,000 was taken from Act 13, not the general fund. Mr. Lynch said as a loan. Commissioner Zimmerlink asked if any other money was loaned. Mr. Lynch said \$1.4 million from the Internal Service Fund, that will be reimbursed with the TRAN. Commissioner Zimmerlink said the loans should get the county through the end of the year to pay the bills. She said it will be repaid. She said it has nothing to do with the state budget. Commissioner Zimmerlink confirmed with Mr. Kriss that all the paperwork has been signed to get his check. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she will ask how soon the checks will be printed.

**Mr. Kriss** said he found it unprofessional that he went to the courthouse and was lied to about someone being in the office. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she would talk to the Controller on January 4 to make sure there is harmony. Commissioner Zapotosky said one issue regarding the hotel tax, before they even got to the issue of discussing for profits or not for profits, there was a vote taken to approve the tax. He said the MOU wasn't written at that time, there was a thumbs up or thumbs down vote to implement, just to get the ball started, they didn't get to the MOU, they didn't discuss for profits, not profits, it was do you support the hotel tax or do you not support the hotel tax, and for clarification purposes, the vote was 2 to 1 with Commissioner Vicites and myself in the affirmative. He said granted, after that, documents, the MOU was prepared and there was discussion further down the road, but the Act itself, 182, was passed in the year 2000, so for eight years the county did nothing to stimulate tourism by passing this tax, this tax was passed in the year 2008 after eight years of losing three million dollars plus in revenue. He said the first vote was not a vote on for profits and not for profits, it was

do you support the implementation of a hotel tax, and it was a 2 to 1 vote, just for clarification purposes.

**Commissioner Zimmerlink** said, just for clarification purposes, although there wasn't a public meeting, OK, regarding what the intent of the hotel tax would be and who would receive it, there were certainly comments made and discussions made during a campaign and it was stated clearly that it would be for non-profits only and she came out and said at the beginning she would support if they included the for profits. She said it is what it is, it has been done, it will be advanced today and it will be handled come January. Commissioner Zapotosky said if there was such an interest, it would have been done in 2000. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she wasn't a commissioner in 2000, but go ahead. Joseph Schiffbauer said he feels it is irresponsible for a lame duck board to approve a five year contract. He asked what the hurry is. Commissioner Ambrosini said the reason that it is important to do it is because they have a substandard IT department through no fault of their own. He said they don't have the training, and it isn't big enough for the size of the county. He said they need a higher level of professionalism that the county can't afford. He said it is a good idea to contract it out. Mr. Schiffbauer asked them to sit on it for a month. He said it is irresponsible.

**Diane Kriss** said she wanted to make a statement about the MOU. She said as a nonprofit owner of the Meason House, if this is approved she can now utilize hotel tax money, but why should she be discriminated against to match dollar for dollar and only use it for marketing when for profits don't. She said they should wait until the new board comes in, and see if they will open it up and make it fair for everyone.

**Commissioner Zimmerlink** asked Mr. Abraham if the transfer was done for the 1.4 and he replied yes. Mr. Abraham said that is included in the 1.8. Commissioner Zimmerlink asked if the general fund has enough money to pay the vendors and payroll. Mr. Abraham said the auditor has suggested that \$1,806,000 is what they have to maintain to keep the courthouse running and keep the county running until the TRAN note comes in and at this time we should not pay until the TRAN note comes in. Commissioner Zimmerlink asked if that meant to not issue checks from the general fund. Mr. Abraham said yes. Commissioner Zimmerlink asked if that was for all employees and elected officials, or just the vendors. Mr. Abraham said that was included in running the courthouse, payroll. Commissioner Zimmerlink said so, you said the auditors, and she wasn't putting him on the spot. Mr. Abraham said he understands it is common practice, years past. Commissioner Zimmerlink said counties, not just Fayette, they borrow money, which is the tax anticipation note. Mr. Abraham said they will be paid in January. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she understands that, it is on the agenda, they repay it because they are anticipating and pay it back. Mr. Abraham said this year they paid it in full, so they could get another one. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she got it, but that's not her question, it is there is money to pay bills to pay the general fund in December, is that right? Mr. Abraham said the TRAN note, 1.8 million.

**Commissioner Zimmerlink** said so the auditors stated not to pay any bills from the general fund, cautioned, suggested? Mr. Abraham said cautioned to her discretion to pick and choose as to what is going to keep us running. Commissioner Zimmerlink said, OK, to pick and choose, who will be picking and choosing, will that be the Controller's office, are you picking your stacks? Mr. Abraham said it will be her discretion to keep the courthouse, the county running. Commissioner Zimmerlink said alright, OK, thank you. She said she read in the newspaper that he was hired as the Chief Deputy Clerk so you could help with the budget, and she also read that Mr. Lynch will not be here after today, so her question is does the Controller's office have in their possession, or will you have in your possession all the necessary information, backup work, documentation, whether in New World or hard copy so that we can justify the budget, and when she says we it's the commissioners now and you who will be here, I who will be here, and the two new ones coming in, will be, and the Chief Clerk who will be here, OK, will be able to pull a number from that budget and be able to pull a number from the budget where the number is coming from so she doesn't have to hear no, I don't know why it wasn't done or this or that, because she doesn't want to hear that in 2016, not just from your office but from ours as well.

**Mr. Abraham** said he hasn't seen the budget for this year, for 2016, rather. Commissioner Zimmerlink said you didn't see it, I believe that is what I read in the paper maybe that is just coming from another individual, to help with the budget. Mr. Abraham said to help with the audit. Commissioner Zimmerlink said OK, so right now do you know if you have any supporting documents? Mr. Abraham said toward the audit? Commissioner Zimmerlink said no, for the budget? Mr. Abraham said, not he is not aware. Commissioner Zimmerlink said could you make absolutely, positively, 100 percent certain that before the end of the day, since Mr. Lynch said he is leaving any backup documentation on New World system, our financial system or any other, that you have that. Commissioner Zapotosky said he wanted to ask a few questions. He said

the county's single audit has yet to be completed, is that correct? He said that posed a threat to the county in a number of ways, A, our Moody's rating and our ability to borrow from our TAN. He said Mr. Lynch's efforts to draft for Moody's purposes a sufficient form of audit allowed us to stay afloat as we broach the year 2016, is that correct? Mr. Abraham said yes. Commissioner Zapotosky said he wanted to make that crystal clear. Mr. Abraham said any other questions should be directed to his office. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she wanted to talk about another issue that came up earlier today, you and the Acting Controller after the meeting please.

Commissioner Zimmerlink asked if she was aware there is a work order system called Facility Dude and when employees have an IT problem they plug it in.

**Ms. Richardson** said she wasn't aware of that. Commissioner Zimmerlink said they will provide something they already have. Ms. Richardson said to reply to her comment, to their knowledge it isn't working. Commissioner Zimmerlink said that's why she wants to sit down, nothing against her, she doesn't know her, they have already said it, so keep that in mind. He said he has been an asset and a compassionate commissioner who cares about the people of the county and the courthouse. He said any statement like that reflects on that person's integrity.
