

A meeting of the Fayette County Board of Commissioners was held at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, January 28, 2015 in Courtroom One of the Fayette County courthouse.

Commissioner Zapotosky called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m.

A silent prayer was observed. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Zimmerlink asked Commissioner Zapotosky to add two items to the agenda before the public comment on agenda items is taken. She said she will make a motion to add it to the agenda and then they can discuss it. She said both will be under the commissioners, which is number 16.

A motion was made by Commissioner Zimmerlink and seconded by Commissioner Zapotosky to amend the agenda to consider accepting the additional sum of \$2,000 from Burnett Oil Company as a payment adjustment for terms under the compressor station ground lease, which the parties terminated pursuant to a resolution dated December 16, 2014.

Commissioner Ambrosini said he would also like to make an amendment to the agenda, the motion is to allow us to vote on accepting the three prime contracts for the CYS building extension, the three low bidders which were the general construction contract, the mechanical contract and the plumbing contract. Commissioner Zimmerlink said if you could clarify, what's the bid number? She said you want us to award bid number what, to whom and for what purpose? Commissioner Zapotosky said do you have a copy of that so that we could. Commissioner Ambrosini asked, John, do you have that bid number? Solicitor Cupp said 15 01, and Commissioner Ambrosini said he thinks that is correct. Commissioner Zimmerlink said and it is for what contract? Commissioner Ambrosini said the contracts are the general construction, the GC contract, the mechanical construction and the plumbing, they are the three out of the four contracts that were low bid. Commissioner Zimmerlink said general construction, election, plumbing, what, I don't know, I didn't see any of the bids, is it plumbing, electric, general?

Commissioner Ambrosini said the three contracts are for the general construction, the mechanical construction and the plumbing construction. Commissioner Zimmerlink said Solicitor Cupp, the last communication that I received from you, and I know that it was sent also to the other two commissioners sometime late yesterday was that you met with Commissioner Ambrosini and Rob Sleighter to discuss the status of those bids and that you were going to review a document, a procurement manual as well as wait to receive information from Rob Sleighter and that upon your receipt of the information you would review it and then render a legal opinion, is that right? Solicitor Cupp said yes. Commissioner Zimmerlink said did you have an opportunity, and she believes his e-mail also said that around 2:30 or 3 o'clock, that you did not believe that you would be in a position to render a legal opinion prior to meeting today but if you were you would send us that opinion and you haven't sent that yet, is that correct? Solicitor Cupp said that is correct. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she isn't prepared to make a decision until she allows him an opportunity to review that and then send us your legal opinion.

Commissioner Zapotosky said if he may add, he talked to Rob Sleighter prior to the meeting and they discussed the matter and then we were waiting for a response from Mr. Cupp regarding the legal side of it and he is still waiting for that, did he review the questions to see what it is. Solicitor Cupp said to give them a timeline, they had the meeting on Monday the 26th, on Tuesday the 27th he went to the website where he gets things from the Commonwealth and they had changed the recommendations manual that they published in 2003, they changed it in December of 2014 and it did not appear on the website last week, he didn't know if it was there Monday, it was certainly there Tuesday so he had to go through that manual and then at 3:25 yesterday he got Mr. Sleighter's letter. He said he doesn't have any disagreement with Mr. Sleighter's letter but he hasn't had an opportunity to go through this entire manual and Mr. Sleighter's manual and write a memorandum. He said he would be doing a disservice if he were trying to write that memorandum in such a short period of time.

Commissioner Zapotosky said in the best interest of the taxpayers the prudence that we, is a necessity. Solicitor Cupp said he would get them the, yes, he will get them the memorandum in the next couple days and you may want to take action and ratify it at

the next meeting. He said he probably couldn't get it to them until Friday. Commissioner Zapotosky said there is a motion on the floor, is there a second to the motion? He again called for a second to the motion and then said let the record reflect that the request made to amend the agenda by Commissioner Ambrosini failed based on no second. Prior to taking public comment on agenda items, Commissioner Zimmerlink asked if everyone has a copy of the agenda.

Public Comment

Terry Kriss said he wanted to comment on the commissioner's meeting on January 8 concerning the commissioners making board appointments. He said he was reading in the paper that there is a gentleman who is now deceased who was appointed to the Industrial Development Authority Board. He said if the commissioners would meet with and interview candidates it would solve this unfortunate problem. He said on the other side of this coin he did some thinking and the gentleman has been deceased for over two years and his question is this, he said according to the paper this is a board with members, and why couldn't the board members pick up a phone or email and let you know that a member is deceased and you need to fill that position. He said also, they had never met or made any decisions or done anything since 2010, why does a board who doesn't know each other, never meets, never convenes, what are they doing? He said is there any protocol in place in the county where they could meet at the end of the year or the beginning of the year and get chairs on committees they could if there is someone who is deceased let you know so this doesn't happen in the future.

Commissioner Ambrosini said Mr. Kriss, as I stated at that meeting he was in favor of them interviewing everybody, no matter whether they have been on the board and want reappointed or they are new individuals wanting to serve and do some public service and he thinks that this is obviously unfortunate and if they would take the steps to interview every single person for every single board appointment we would eliminate these type of issues. Mr. Kriss said he did say that to him the other day but the excuse that he didn't do this is because you didn't get an e-mail and he said as a community leader who knows this happens every year to have taken that stand, you are fully aware of it, you have done it, and you have done it in the past and I think if you would have done your job and done what you just told me you should have done maybe this wouldn't have happened but it's done. He said he also questioned why none of the board members had communicated with the commissioners about filling the board. He said they need some help both ways. He said in the future, two things, having interviews across the board would be fair to everybody and maybe a chair of these boards can keep everybody informed so something like this doesn't happen again. He said if there haven't been meeting for four years, do you really need that board and it is nothing person against those people or that board.

Commissioner Zapotosky said it is his understanding that it is a state statute so he isn't sure so he can't answer the question but in all due respect somebody in the

planning and zoning office you would think after a while, the decedent, we would have gotten some information. Mr. Kriss said not pointing fingers, not blaming anyone. Commissioner Zapotosky said he is not blaming anybody either, he said. Mr. Kriss said it really should not have happened at all. He said there is a lack of communication and it is important that people be interviewed personally and asked questions, you get a better feel for people what their true desires are and you could get a bigger mix of people. Commissioner Zimmerlink said she will comment on this. She said in the past two to three years there have been many times as many of the board members who are currently on boards will confirm that they were contacted for appointment and when they came to the meeting, the scheduled appointment, and I am talking for 2012, 2013 and 2014 at which time the three commissioners that you see here were the ones that scheduled the appointments with their assistants and it was scheduled for the conference room, 2012, 2013 and 2014, many times there were only one commissioner, at times there were two, a few times there were three.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said there were times and this can all be confirmed if there needs to be another story on it, you can sit down and do that, you can contact a number of individuals and it was said in the past, and she is talking this current board of commissioners, that I don't see to see this individual because I know him or her or, I'll speak with them on the phone, or, we just appointed them last year and the reasons that was said by fellow commissioners is because some terms of five years, some terms of four, some terms of three and other terms are one year. She said at the beginning of this commissioner's meeting, one commissioner said that he did not feel comfortable in voting on any of the boards because we did not interview but then proceeded to vote, which doesn't make sense to me but it happened. She said speaking specifically for this board, I'm gonna tell you about the protocol, there is nothing in writing but I will tell you about the protocol and how it has been happening since I have been a commissioner, 2004, and I believe that we have done a good job in the resolutions that were passed in the prior years, if you go back and look in the term of 2004 to 2008 there were many times that the board appointments and the resolutions went very smooth.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said if you look back in the beginning of the 2012 term you will see, as evidenced by resolutions and minutes that many of the resolutions had to be rescinded, why, because although motions were made, one commissioner, me, would say, this person does not want to be appointed or we have been asked by the executive director to hold off, so it appears as evidenced by minutes and resolutions, that the problem for the boards has only occurred in the last, maybe, two years. She said that is no excuse, all three commissioners here are responsible for the final product even though we do have department heads, commissioner assistants and chief clerks that work for us and work for the county, yes the ultimate responsibility rests on the three that you see here and we must rely also on our staff as well as members of the boards and executive directors, things of that nature for these boards. She said I don't believe any commissioner said it is not my fault, none of us said that.

Commissioner Zapotosky said if I could, and Commissioner Zimmerlink said I'm on a roll here, see how easily I can get, because I have a lot on my mind. Commissioner Zapotosky said he apologizes and he just wanted to thank her because he knows the

work that she did put in and he remembered walking in and she and Kathy were with papers all over your office. Commissioner Zimmerlink said it's not just me. Commissioner Zapotosky said he is just saying you did a lot of work. Commissioner Zimmerlink said all three commissioners are responsible, OK, with their assistants or without their assistants and with their chief clerks, and with their department head. She said normally what occurs is if you have a board, I'll give you an example, only because she sees two people back there and it made her think, housing authority board, or an airport board, we receive letters at times like from the executive director and they say this individual wishes to be reappointed or this individual does not wish to be reappointed, that's how the county knows.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said also they receive individual letters, at times, not always, from current board members who wish to have their terms extended. She said when they don't receive a letter from the current board that wants their term to be extended or renewed, than many times someone has to, in the courthouse, we pick up the phone and we ask them, have you talked with your board member or we actually call the individual, so there is great care that is taken in this process. She said how many boards, does anyone here know, that we have, anyone know how many boards that we have, yeah, interesting, I do. She said how many boards did we appoint on this date, I believe it was 16. She said the agenda and the information and the paperwork that went between the three commissioners and their assistants and chief clerk was numerous. She said it was an error to place on the agenda that particular board. She said the error was not just of an individual who had passed away two years prior, the error was placing the entire board on the agenda. She said there were 16 on that agenda, only 15 should have been on there and as we said during that meeting that we had additional boards to appoint.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said Kathy, not to put you on the spot, but is it accurate to say that we have probably about five or six additional boards to appoint? Mrs. Winkler said about and Commissioner Zimmerlink said approximately, so it is not written in stone. She said five or six to review and to appoint or re appoint. She said and we will continue to use that same process. She said in this particular instance on this board at one time it was, and I'll tell ya, I missed it, OK, I missed it, at one time it was in the stack that we were going to appoint and at other times it was on the other pile of papers that no, we should not be appointing because we had not contacted nor did we hear from the individuals and/or the contact person for the particular board. She said at one time there was an individual who passed away in 2008 and we received a letter, it was Commissioner Zapotosky, myself and Vicites and we received a letter from the contact person of the industrial board who actually said this individual had passed away you will need to re-appoint, this time it didn't happen, OK, but again, we, all of us could have picked up the phone and said, what's the board make up.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said for them not meeting since 2010 should not be news to the three of us, or to really any staff member who may have been employed in the past many years because we all should be reading the same paperwork and also even for Commissioner Ambrosini who has been here since 2012, it defined what that board does and why it is needed, it, also when we made appointments in the prior years,

stated that it does not meet on a regular basis, it only meets when needed to perform specific duties. She said and, as she recalls at one time, that board, as well as these other boards, I'll give you another example, the UCC Board, that board has been created as far back as our term, the 2008 term, and it hasn't met once, and why, because no one has appealed, but does that it doesn't exist or shouldn't exist, no, and at that time from the director, it was stated from the commissioners, we will appoint as terms come up, the same individuals because they had agreed to serve when called upon and in the event that you no longer wish to serve, you move out of the area, whatever the case may be, you notify us, through the planning and zoning, through the UCC. She said so, why would there be a need to interview individuals and say do you want to go back on the board, tell us then, you know what kind of, how silly that would have been, obviously since they hadn't had any meetings, it's not their fault they hadn't had any meetings, citizens haven't filed an appeal, but, were there conversations, there should have been and I believe that there was, between the department head and those individuals, do you still wish to serve in the event there is an appeal hearing, yes, therefore it happens.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said was it done for the industrial development, it slid by all three of us, it will be addressed, and again, it's not just because of an individual who passed away, it's because the entire board needs to be looked at to see who these other individuals who may want to serve. She said but, I will agree that when, there is a responsibility for not only the commissioners, not only the staff, but also the board and the fellow board members, if you have been appointed and you wonder, and I can you that no one appointed can tell me, regardless of what was said in the paper, that they were appointed and didn't know what their duties were because why they initially would have come in for an interview they would have been told that and also the agency itself would have sent the information on to them, at least that is what we have always been told and I remember some of these conversations, OK, so all I can tell you is that particular one should have never been placed on that agenda to begin with, it was an oversight, normally, Miss Attention to Detail here, you know, everybody knows that I always say, hey let's slow up a little bit, well, normally I pick something like that up, I didn't, at that time whenever we were going through, I should have looked at it and said, you know what, I don't think we are ready for this, it was missed by me and apparently it was missed by Commissioner Zapotosky and apparently missed by Commissioner Ambrosini.

Commissioner Zimmerlink said the three of us will remedy that. Mr. Kriss said he wanted to ask just one question, did this person contact any of the commissioners or just the Herald-Standard? Commissioner Zimmerlink said your question was did that individual contact me, I'll answer for, no, no, no from me. Mr. Kriss asked if anyone received any information. Commissioner Zapotosky said he isn't aware of receiving any e-mails. Commissioner Zimmerlink said had that occurred, or when individuals move out of the state, then normally we receive something that says so and so did not want to be reappointed or they are leaving the state, they are going to school, doing this, whatever the case may be, and that is why at times you will see, during the course of the year, us making a board appointment, which is not unlikely either. She said because we are

short a member for whatever reason, so if you look over the past history, but, I know it was long but, you know, OK, thank you.

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development has invited the County of Fayette to submit an application in the amount of \$249,858 for Federal Fiscal Year 2014, for financial assistance in non-entitlement areas of Fayette County, and in the total amount of \$831,561 for Federal Fiscal Year 2014 on behalf of the eight (8) entitlement townships of Bullskin Township, Dunbar Township, Georges Township, Gennan Township, Luzerne Township, Menallen Township, North Union Township, and Redstone Township; for a grand total amount of \$1,081,419 in assistance under the Community Development Block Grant Program (hereinafter referred to as "the Program"); and

WHEREAS, the County of Fayette has met all the citizen participation requirements relative to the CDBG Program submission; and

WHEREAS, the County of Fayette has prepared a Three Year Community Development Plan as required by the Department of Community and Economic Development; and

WHEREAS, the County of Fayette has, by resolution adopted the 19th day of December, 1985, designated the Redevelopment Authority of the County of Fayette, Pennsylvania, to be its agent in preparing applications and for administration of the grants, which designation assures that Fayette County meets the "General Qualifications Criteria" contained in the law and regulations governing the Program; and

WHEREAS, a form of Cooperation Agreement, by and between the County of Fayette and the Redevelopment Authority of the County of Fayette, Pennsylvania is offered for consideration by the Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Authority of the County of Fayette, Pennsylvania is preparing an application for financial assistance under the Program, said application having been made available for public comment, review, and inspection prior to consideration by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Fayette; and

WHEREAS, in order to comply with the administration of the CDBG Program, the Redevelopment Authority has also prepared the following plans and policies: Code of Conduct and Conflict of Interest Policy, Drug Free Workplace Policy, Excessive Force Policy, Anti-Displacement Plan, MBE / WBE Plan, Section 3 Plan, Fair Housing Analysis and Annual Action Plan, 504 Plan, and CDBG Procurement Policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Fayette:

1. That the Program Application is hereby in all respects approved. The Clerk is hereby directed to file an overview of said Program Application with the minutes of this meeting.
2. That the following plans are approved in compliance with CDBG rules and regulations: Code of Conduct and Conflict of Interest Policy, Drug Free Workplace Policy, Excessive Force Policy, Anti-Displacement Plan, MBE WBE Plan, Section 3 Plan, Fair Housing Analysis and Annual Action Plan, 504 Plan, and CDBG Procurement Policy.
3. That it is cognizant of the conditions that are imposed in the undertaking and carrying out of community development activities with Federal/State financial assistance under Title I, including those under Title VI relating to the prohibition of discrimination because of race, color, creed or national origin and other assurances as may be forthcoming from the State for the implementation of the Program.
3. That the Commissioners of Fayette County are authorized to file an application for financial assistance to carry out the Program and act as the authorized representative of the County of Fayette.
4. That the Commissioners are hereby authorized to provide such assurances and/or certifications as may be required by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and any supplemental or revised data which the Department of Community and Economic Development may request in connection with its review of the application and including any revisions necessary to bring the application into conformity with the Department's final grant for the County and its Entitlement Boroughs and Townships.
